- Defer the application of a penalty of 2.5% on any outstanding balance until November 30, 2020.









Are you and your family personally prepared for an emergency for 72 hours? That's right 3 days! The best way to help you be prepared is to create an emergency kit. You don't need to purchase an expensive kit, rather make your own kit using household items you may already have....Using a second hand or unused suitcase or backpack will help house your emergency supplies. Keep your kit close to your door for easy grab n' go.

BASIC EMERGENCY KIT

- Water at least two litres of water per person per day; include small bottles that can be carried easily in case of an evacuation order
- Food that won't spoil, such as canned food, energy bars and dried foods (replace food and water once a year)
- Manual can-opener
- Crank or battery-powered flashlight (and extra batteries). Replace batteries once a year

- Extra keys to your car and house •
- Some cash in smaller bills, such as \$10 bills & change •
- A copy of your emergency plan and contact information

If applicable, other items such as prescription medication, infant formula, equipment for people with disabilities, or food, water and medication for your pets or service animal (personalize according to your needs)
