CAMPFIRE BAN IN EFFECT!

Campfires are prohibited across the region until October 31, OR until the order is rescinded. This prohibition is to help prevent human

caused wildfires and protect public safety. These prohibitions apply to ALL

public and private land.



The following types of open fires are also prohibited:

- Category 1, 2 & 3 fires
- Fireworks
- Sky Lanterns
- Burn Barrels
- Burn Cages
- Binary exploding targets
- Tiki & similar kind of torches
- Chimineas

The prohibition does not include the use of CSA-rated or ULC-rated device outdoor stoves for cooking, heat or ambignee that burn charcoal briquettes. liquid fuel or gaseous fuel, and has a flame height that is less than 15 cm tall.

Anyone who lights, fuels or uses an open fire when a fire prohibition is in place or fails to comply with an open fire prohibition may be issued a ticket for \$1,150 or, if convicted in court, be fined up to \$100,000 and/or sentenced to one year in jail. If the contravention causes or contributes to a wildfire, the person responsible may be subject to a penalty of up to \$100,000 and ordered to pay all firefighting and associated costs.

District of Port Hardy WATER CONSERVATION LEVEL

Stage 3 water restrictions are necessary to conserve water during times of drought and to ensure water is available in times of emergency.

PROHIBITED

- Watering a lawn or boulevard.
- Filling pools, hot tubs or garden pond.
- Filling or operation of a decorative fountain
- Washing vehicles, boats, or RVs.
- Pressure washing of sidewalks, driveways, parking lots, windows etc. EXCEPT as necessary for applying a product such as paint, preservative & stucco, preparing a surface prior to paving or repointing bricks, or if required by law to comply with health [& safety regulations.



· Watering of trees, shrubs, flowers and vegetables on any day between 7-9 A.M. & 8-10 P.M. by hand held container or hose with a shut off nozzle.



WATER CONSERVATION TIPS TO GET YOU

Implementing Towflow showerheads can save an average household up to 11,000 litres of water per year, significantly reducing water usage.

Practicing responsible landscaping techniques, such as using native plants, mulching, and adjusting sprinkler systems can reduce

outdoor water usage by up to 50% By complying with water restrictions, residents demonstrate community responsibility. Everyone plays a part in conserving water and safeguarding the well-being of their

population.

Fixing a leaky faucet that drips at a rate of one drop per second can save up to 11.356 litres of water per year, which is equivalent to 180 showers!

Following water restrictions helps prevent water shortages and the need for more drastic measures, such as water rationing or increased water prices, which can significantly impact residents' daily lives and budgets.

2023 PROPERTY TAXES. **HOMEOWNER GRANT & TAX SALE**

Current year property taxes were due July 4, 2023. A 10% penalty has now been applied to outstanding balances.

HOMEOWNER GRANT

Eligible homeowners should have claimed the 2023 Homeowner Grant on or before July 4. A penalty has been applied to the unclaimed grant portion of outstanding property taxes. The LAST day to claim the grant for the current year is December 31, 2023.

RETROACTIVE HOMEOWNER GRANT

Didn't claim your grant in 2022? Claim before December 31. 2023.
