Property Assessment/Review Process



2024 property assessments are now available. A property's assessment value is set by the BC Assessment Authority and is based on the market value as of July 1 of the previous year. If you have auestions or concerns regarding your property's assessed value here are some first steps:

- 1. Review all the details on your Assessment Notice issued by BC Assessment.
- 2. Discuss any questions or concerns you may have with the local assessment office, call 1-866 valueBC (1-866-825-8322).
- 3. Request a formal review IN WRITING by filing a written notice of complaint with the assessor by 11:59 pm PST, JANUARY 31.

2023 Property Taxes, **Utilities & Homeowner Grants**



Outstanding property taxes & utilities as of December 31, 2023 have now been transferred to arrears taxes and are accruing DAILY INTEREST. Payments can be made through online banking, by cheque, cash or debit at the Municipal Hall.

Eligible homeowners should have claimed their 2023 Homeowner Grant on or before July 4th. A penalty has now been applied to the unclaimed grant portion of outstanding property taxes. The LAST DAY to claim the grant for the 2023 is December 31, 2024. Eligible homeowners must claim the grant every year!



Looking to operate a Short Term Vacation Rental (STVR), also referred to as an Air B&B, in Port Hardy? Operators of a STRV must ensure compliance with all zoning, use, building, health, licensing and any other requirements, including a business

*** WINTER ROAD MAINTENANCE

While the weather has been relatively mild thus far, the District's winter road maintenance crews are ready to jump into action at a moment's notice. Sometimes it can be a big job, and the little things count. Here are some reminders about what you can do to help!

DON'T PARK ON THE ROAD

Avoiding parking on the road or sidewalks. A vehicle, RV or trailer parked on a street interferes with sanding and/or snow removal operations. Violators risk being towed or fined.

KEEP THE SIDEWALK CLEAR OF ICE & SNOW

Remove ice or snow from sidewalks or footpaths bordering commercial and residential properties by 10 AM. Do not shovel snow from driveways or walkways onto the street. Please do not flag down operators as this slows maintenance efforts.

OUR CREW IS SMALL BUT MIGHTY!

Crews work hard to diligently tend to the roads and streets as quickly as possible following a weather event. Expect delays after a flash freeze or snowfall event and plan for extra travel time. First priority is arterial roads and emergency routes followed by secondary routes, including residential roads, one-way and dead end streets, and sidewalks.
