
Here are some basic steps you can take to be emergency ready:



NOW IN EFFECT LEVEL 1 WATERING RESTRICTIONS



DISTRICT OF PORT HARDY WATER CONSERVATION LEVEL

Stage One watering restrictions took effect March 19, 2024. These measures are implemented in an effort to get ahead of water conservation following a dry winter, forecasts of drought, and highwater demand. Water conservation is a shared responsibility, that of both users and the local government. By taking early action with community-wide conservation measures, together we can take the necessary steps to curb overconsumption, reduce waste. and ensure everyone's water needs are met throughout the year, especially during an emergency.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

Stay informed! Know the latest water conservation status, follow watering restrictions and permitted uses by stage. Spread the word! Help educate neighbours, family, friends, and visitors on the water conservation stage. Report infractions.

Fix leaky faucets or broken fixtures. Take shorter showers or shallower baths. Turn off the tap when brushing your teeth. Fill the sink when washing the dishes. Fill & store a jug of water in the fridge for fresh, cold water rather than running the tap. Plant drought-friendly trees, shrubs, & vegetation. Water the garden & plants in the early morning or later in the evening.

Equip hoses with a water-controlled nozzle. Use a rain barrel to collect rain water. Recycle water when possible.

RESIDENTIAL WATERING RESTRICTIONS

Watering restrictions are in effect annually, May 1-October 31.



Established and enforceable by bylaw. each water conservation level quides residential and commercial water use through a step-wise restriction of nonessential activities. View the guide to learn the permitted activities

by stage.

FREE PICK-UP AT THE CURB FOR SENIORS & **PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES**


