## Re: Invitation to Participate in 2026 Emergency Preparedness Fair

Dear Grade 4-7 Classes,

Every May, Port Hardy Emergency hosts an annual event to kick-off Emergency Preparedness Week. This well-attended public event has been widely supported with educational and interactive displays from our emergency response partners including Port Hardy Fire Rescue, RCMP, Canadian Coast Guard, B.C. Ambulance Service, BC Wildfire, Canadian Rangers Patrol, the District of Port Hardy's Animal Control and Operational Services departments.

For 2026, Port Hardy Emergency will host a symposium style event. To help with this initiative, Port Hardy Gr. 4-7 classes are invited to join Port Hardy Emergency and local response partners to help raise community awareness on this important subject. Students would research and create an emergency-themed display that focuses on a key topic of emergency preparedness and readiness such as:

- A hazard type & risk (earthquake, tsunami, wildfire, severe weather, etc.)
- Building an emergency kit (for home, car, or at work)
- Make an emergency plan (household or business)
- Evacuation zones

Displays would be presented by 1-5 students. The public will be invited to attend the event to view the displays and ask the students about their topic. Our goal is to create conversation and awareness around emergency preparedness amongst the younger generations and to share this valuable information with the community.

We invite your class to participate in this event, planned for during the week of May 4-8, 2026, at the Port Hardy Civic Centre. To avoid duplication of topics, student groups can sign up for a topic in a first-come, first served fashion.
